### Defensible Space

By taking a few simple steps you can create a defensible space around your home. Doing so will greatly reduce the likelihood of a wildfire damaging your home. Defensible space is an area surrounding your home where the vegetation, and sometimes the structure itself, has been modified in order to separate



the "fuels" that a wildfire feeds from. This is designed to achieve three purposes.

- Allow firefighters room to operate
- Stop the fire from spreading to your home.
- Give your home the ability to survive a wildfire on it's own.

# **Vegetation Modifications**

- I. Have your address visible and access well marked with letters or numbers of at least 3 inches.
- Maintain a well irrigated circumference of at least 30 feet around your home.
- Keep areas surrounding your home mowed to approximately 2 inches or less.
- Relocate woodpiles at least 30 feet away from your home.
- Keep gutters clear of leaves and other debris.
- Rake leaves, grass and other debris and remove them from your yard.
- 7. Check your driveway for adequate access for emergency vehicles.
- 8. Maintain mowed areas around vehicles or other equipment.
- Store, gas, oil and other chemicals away from your home.

## **Structural Modifications**

- Use fire resistive building materials, especially the roof.
- Install chimney screens or spark arrestors.



- Enclose foundations and roof/attic openings to prevent embers from entering.
- 4. Develop external water-sources near your home.
- 5. Protect windows and glass doors with fire resistant drapes.
- Operate barbeque grills in areas away from combustible materials.
